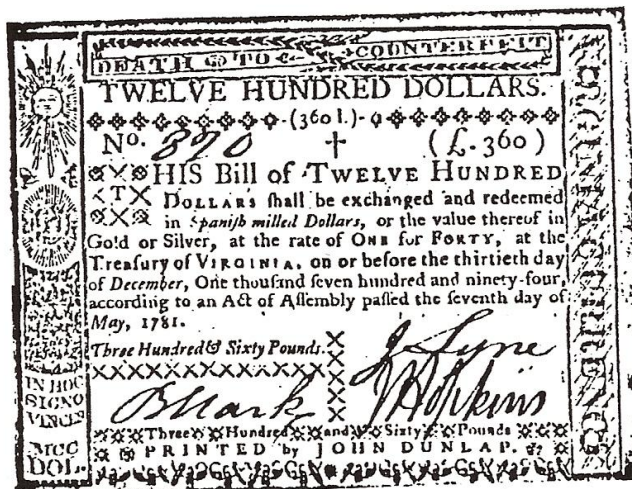

Married to George Abyvon.

No direct descendants, her will mentions sister-in-law Sarah Willoughby, nieces Elizabeth Godfrey, Elizabeth Brown, Sarah Loyall, Mary Colly, Peggy West, and Alice Wilson, and nephew, Jas. Godfrey.

**Abyvon, Mariam.** Wife of George Abyvon, Mariam (*aka* Miriam, Manim, Marrim, Meriam, Marrim & Marsam) provided supplies of 3 gallons of rum. Her will mentions sister-in-law Sarah Willoughby, six nieces and nephew Jas. Godfrey. Mariam died between November 20<sup>th</sup> 1794 and February 23<sup>rd</sup> 1795.
