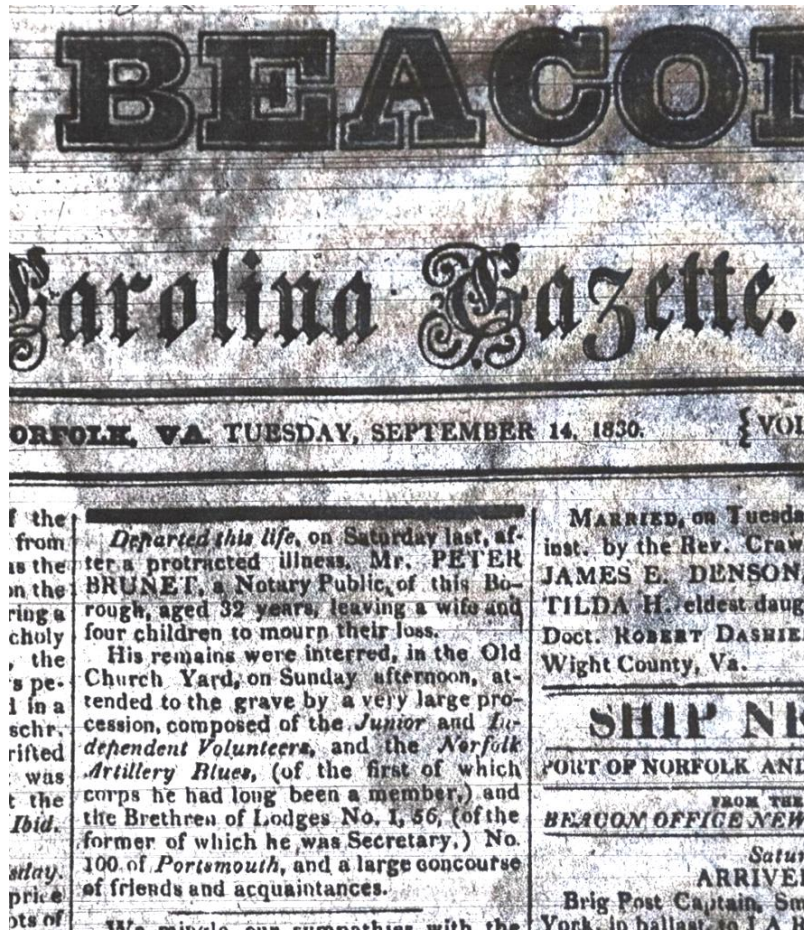

Selected War of 1812 Compiled Military Service Records⁽¹⁾ (Appended at bottom.)

Notes: Peter Brunet was born about 1798. He served as a private in the 9th Regiment (Sharp's) Virginia Militia from 21 August to 26 October 1814 during the War of 1812. After the war he served in the peace time militia in the Independent Volunteers and was a Mason. Brunet died in September 1830 after a protracted illness, leaving a wife and four children.
