


Chamberlain(e), George

Captain William W. Chamberlaine, of Norfolk, distinguished in the record of Mahone's brigade, and in the artillery of the army of Northern Virginia, was born at Norfolk, October 16, 1836. His father, Richard H. Chamberlaine, born in the same city June 7, 1807, died July 23, 1879, was a banker and influential citizen. George Chamberlaine, father of the latter, a shipbuilder and soldier of the war of 1812, was the son of George Chamberlaine, of Warrick County, a sea captain and lieutenant in the Virginia Navy during the Revolution.¹



Title Died- On Tuesday last, Mr. George Chamberlain, of this town. Buried on Wednesday in the Church yard. (p. 3, c. 2)
Publication Saturday, January 14, 1792.



DIED.) Suddenly, on Tuesday Morning last, Mr. **GEORGE CHAMBERLAIN**, of this town; a gentleman universally esteemed by all who knew him: On Wednesday his remains, attended by the Master & Brethren of the Norfolk Lodge, and a great number of the respectable inhabitants of this Borough, were decently interred in the Church Yard, and a well adapted discourse delivered by the Rev. James Whitehead.

He has left an amiable wife and child, and a widowed mother, to lament the loss of an affectionate husband, parent and son.

Ceremony Commemorative Printed Program paragraph:

Chamberlain, George. Born in 1755, he served as a lieutenant in the Navy of the Revolution aboard five vessels, two of which (the Pilot Boat *Molly* and the Light Boat *Liberty*), he commanded after having escaped imprisonment in England. He married Ann Harlow Lucas, and they had one son of the same name, “of Norfolk.”
