



Resolution of the Norfolk Chapter of the Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution in support of the "Honor and Remember Flag" as an official symbol created to recognize and honor members of the Armed Forces who have died in the line of duty, and in support of efforts urging the United States Congress to adopt this Flag as a national symbol.

Whereas, since the Revolutionary War, more than one million members of the United States Armed Forces have sacrificed their lives in the line of duty to preserve American freedom; and

Whereas, there is no greater love of country exhibited than by those who would lay down their lives for their fellow men and women; and

Whereas, the service and sacrifice of those fallen members of our Armed Forces are deserving of national recognition; and

Whereas, there is presently no officially-recognized symbol to acknowledge and honor members of our Armed Forces, who have died in the line of duty; and

Whereas, Congressman J. Randy Forbes has introduced House of Representatives Bill 1034, which proposes to amend Chapter 9 of Title 36 of the United States Code to designate the "Honor and Remember Flag" created by Honor and Remember, Incorporated of Chesapeake, Virginia as an official symbol to recognize and honor members of our Armed Forces who have died in the line of duty; and

Whereas, the "Honor and Remember Flag" will serve as a symbol of national gratitude for all members of the Armed Forces who have given their lives for our freedom, as a perpetual reminder for all Americans to acknowledge the ultimate price of freedom, and will offer solace and comfort to the families who have lost loved ones in military service;



RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE “HONOR AND REMEMBER FLAG AS AN OFFICIAL SYMBOL CREATED TO RECOGNIZE AND HONOR MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES WHO HAVE DIED IN THE LINE OF DUTY, AND IN SUPPORT OF EFFORTS URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO ADOPT THIS FLAG AS A NATIONAL SYMBOL.
