American commander: Col Daniel Morgan. British Commander: Lt. Col. Banastre "Bloody" Tarleton. Patriot casualties: 12 dead, 60 wounded. British casualties: 110 dead, 200+ wounded, 500 captured.

Patriotic Inspiration:

In the republic that the Founders envisioned, order would come from the consent and virtue of the people themselves. The farmer-citizen could be counted on to surrender his personal desires for the public good. The common man could be trusted to govern a new republic.

At the time of the American Revolution, the colonists knew that liberty was a dangerous pursuit that put their very lives and livelihoods at risk. Tens of thousands lost their lives either on the battlefields, through disease, or by starvation.

Patriots and ordinary citizens persevered, not just because they were exceptional in their bravery and intellect but also because they believed deeply in the idea of America. They prevailed and proved to the world that the united efforts of ordinary citizens risking all in the pursuit of liberty can free people from tyranny.

Our challenge is to continue this grand experiment in self-government, proving what becomes of a nation founded on the principles of individual freedom and citizen participation.
