## Saint Paul's Churchyard Inscription No. 66

In Memory of  
John Singleton  
Who Departed This Life  
On the 8<sup>th</sup> of June, 1825  
In the 67 Year of His Age

### Revolutionary War Service:

"John Singleton (1758-1825), Private, Captain John Gregory's Company, Colonel Daniel Morgan, 1778; in other regiments of the Virginia Line until discharged at Philadelphia at the close of the war."

#### Researcher's Notes:

Both references list John Singleton's wife as Sarah (Dyson) Singleton. Saint Paul's Churchyard Inscription No. 65 lists Miss Sarah Singleton, who departed this life May 8<sup>th</sup>, 1821, Agd. 52. The Register of the District of Columbia Society indicates William Reynolds Singleton (grandson of John Singleton) was b. in Norfolk, VA. October 24, 1818. His parents, Henry Singleton (son of John Singleton) and Mary Ann Waldron Reynolds, were married in Norfolk, Virginia April 10, 1816.

Singleton, John. In 1778, Singleton was a private in Capt. John Gregory's Company under Col. Daniel Morgan, serving in other regiments of the Virginia line until his discharge at the close of the war. He died on June 8<sup>th</sup> 1825 at the age of 67 years.
